CRIME PREVENTION TIP: WARNING - YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE TARGETED

Criminals are once again walking the streets and alleys looking for easy targets. Follow these simple steps to greatly reduce your chances of being a crime victim:

- Lock Your Vehicle (The vast majority of vehicle break-ins involve unlocked vehicles).
- Do Not Leave Property inside Your Vehicle (This attracts criminals to enter your vehicle. take items with you or put them in the trunk).
- Report Suspicious Activity (If you see someone looking in vehicles or tampering with a vehicle, call 9-1-1). Take the Time Prevent a Crime.



2016 FALL BOULEVARD TREE PLANTING

Do you have a treeless section of your boulevard or public right of way and would like a replacement tree? If so we are still looking for a few additional Fall 2016 tree planting sites and would like to hear from you! The City of Robbinsdale Forester will be installing boulevard trees this fall to continue its proactive reforestation efforts, using bareroot trees currently housed in the City's gravelbed tree nursery. You do not need to have a sidewalk to qualify since nearly all city streets have public rights of way that generally extend 10-14 feet from behind the curb.

There are 24 different tree species available, and a table showing the available species and their general size at maturity is posted on the City's forestry webpage. If you are interested and are willing to regularly water the tree (a TreeGator bag will be provided) please contact Stephan Papiz, City Forester at 763-531-1273 or at spapiz@ci.robbinsdale.mn.us with your name, address and a brief message. Planting site feasibility will depend on available spacing, location of marked underground utilities and planned street reconstruction projects.



WASTE MANAGEMENT'S RECYCLE OFTEN/RECYCLE RIGHT WEBSITE

Need a reminder on what items are recyclable and what items are not? Want to know why plastic bags should not be placed in your recycling cart? Waste Management's *Recycle Often/Recycle Right* website at http://recycleoftenrecycleright.com/ has all the information you ever need to know about recycling. The website includes a video, poster, brochure, myth busters, and more. There are some great tools for schools including a variety of curriculum for grades K-5. Kids tend to be the biggest influencer in getting parents to recycle so getting the information into schools and into the hands of teachers would help kids to take the message home.

YARD WASTE PICK UP GENERALLY RUNS THROUGH MID-NOVEMBER

Reminder: Compostable bags must be used for leaves. Another option is to place leaves in a galvanized or Rubbermaid-type container (not to exceed 30 pounds) clearly labeled "Yard Waste" and placed 3 feet from garbage cart. If multiple containers are used, it is only necessary to label one. You may make your own yard waste sign for your container.

HELP! DON'T PLUG SEWERS WITH GRASS AND LEAVES

City code prohibits raking or depositing grass clippings, leaves, weeds, etc. into the gutter and along the street. The debris will eventually end up in our lakes and streams, which contributes to the deterioration of water quality. The City appreciates your cooperation in helping to keep lakes clean, storm sewers open and streets clean by bagging leaves and/or grass clippings for the yard waste hauler or by properly composting.
