

## ROBBINSDALE SOLID WASTE DISCLOSURE

Minnesota regulations require that we provide you with the following statement verbatim:



*You may be responsible for any liability that results from contamination at a facility where your waste has been deposited. The State of Minnesota believes that its waste management system provides substantially more financial and environmental protection than depositing waste in landfills in other states. Managing your waste in Minnesota may minimize your potential liability.*

Waste Management of Minnesota, Robbinsdale's contracted garbage hauler, only disposes of waste at facilities that are fully permitted and licensed. These facilities are fully compliant with all local, state and federal regulations governing financial and environmental protection. Waste Management of Minnesota complies with specific disposal requirements found in our service agreements and county waste delivery agreements. All waste collected from Robbinsdale is disposed of at the Hennepin County Energy Recovery Center (505 6th Ave No, Minneapolis, MN 55406).

Once completed, the plan will be submitted to neighboring jurisdictions and Metropolitan Council for review. Regular skating hours are Mondays-Thursdays, 5-8:30 pm; Fridays, 5-9 pm; Saturdays, 12:30-9 pm; and Sundays, 12:30-8:30 pm. Rinks may not be open under the following conditions: Significant snowfall, temp below -10F, dangerous wind chill, temp above 32F, poor or unsafe ice conditions, fewer than 5 skaters after 7:00 p.m., ice maintenance. Robbinsdale Deputy Registrar/Motor Vehicle Office offers the following services: **Vehicle Title Transfers, Vehicle Registration Renewals, Boat and Snowmobile Renewals, Passport Services\*, Hunting and Fishing Licenses, Driver's Licenses (change of address, or lost license only; not renewals), and Variety of Specialty License Plates.** Hours: Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and 1st & 2nd Saturday of the month from 9 a.m. to 12 Noon. **\*Passports:** *First-time passports must be done in person and can be processed at Robbinsdale City Hall as well as photo services for both first-time and renewals. Passport renewals must be mailed by the applicant and are not done in person. First-time passport Services are provided Monday through Friday, drop-ins are welcome but sufficient time is needed for processing applications and will only be accepted at the counter between **8:00 am - 3:30 pm during the week.** If you take a number and are not called to the counter by 3:30 pm you will have to come back another day. SATURDAY PASSPORT APPLICATIONS BY APPOINTMENT ONLY, to schedule a Saturday appointment for passport applications, call 763-535-8133, press 1 & then press 3.*



Recycle Often: Metal Cans (steel, tin & aluminum soda, vegetable, fruit & tuna cans); Plastic Bottles & Containers, Paper (Brown paper bags, non-confidential office paper, newspaper, magazines); Dairy & Juice Containers; Flattened Cardboard & Paperboard; Glass Bottles & Jars

Recycle Right – Things you can do to ensure quality material is recycled: DO NOT INCLUDE: Food waste, plastic bags, polystyrene foam cups & containers, hangers or hazardous waste.

- Paper and cardboard must be dry and free of food debris
- Tissues, paper towels or other paper that has been in contact with food is not acceptable
- Make sure food contamination and caps are removed from cans and plastics and all containers are empty
- Separate plastic lids from plastic bottles (often made from different materials)
- Do not place medical waste (needles, catheters or lancets) into the recycling containers
